The HH Jazz Camp was founded by Bob and Lois Masteller along with Music Director, James Berry, a longtime friend and saxophonist, Josh Kravette in 2011. After the Hilton Head Island – Bluffton Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Sorority, Inc. was chartered on February 26, 2012, our first president, Marion Payne, forged a relationship with Bob and Lois Masteller, Founders of the Jr. Jazz Foundation. Their mission was to preserve the art form of Jazz. Thus, HHIBAC DST established the HH Jazz Camp as one of our community service projects in 2013. Since then, we have provided scholarships for students who reside in our service area. Our recruitment for the 2023 HH Jazz Camp started in March 2023. Committee members scouted for talented students by making contact with parents/guardians, educators, church and youth leaders. Five youngsters from our service area attended the 2023 HH Jazz Camp. Three students from Hardeeville High School and two Hilton Head Island received HHIBAC DST camp scholarships. There were 70 campers this year who reside in twelve different states.

In addition to awarding camp scholarships for the past ten years, members of the HHIBAC DST have volunteered during the annual HH Jazz Camp week. Our volunteer efforts do not go unnoticed. Lois Masteller, James Berry, faculty, staff, and campers acknowledge our dedication and service before and during the camp week. This year, HHIBAC DST had ten members who rendered service during the 2023 HH Jazz Camp week. We were very fortunate to have Wanda Woods-Knox's sister, Rosalyn Payne-Hill, a retired music educator, who volunteered and observed how the talented faculty assessed the campers' skill levels and organized them into instructional groups. By the end of the camp week, the campers honed their musical abilities and delivered an amazing Finale Concert on Saturday, July15, 2023.
